- MSU **Missouri State University Scholarships** – The following information is provided as a general overview of scholarships available to entering freshmen. For complete details on scholarship and financial aid programs at MSU, please visit www.missouristate.edu/FinancialAid.
UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP
Value: Board of Governors Scholarship plus \$2,000 per year for the first and second year to be applied to on-campus housing.
Criteria: Students who are invited to interview for the Presidential Scholarship will be considered.
OUT-OF-STATE FEE WAIVER/MIDWEST STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM
Note: This waiver can be combined with any of the scholarships that do not already provide a waiver of out-of-state fees.
Value: A full waiver of out-of-state fees (approximate value \$5,820 annually).
Criteria: Freshmen must demonstrate one of the following: A class ranking in the top 20 percent or a 3.70 GPA (on a 4.0 scale) or a minimum ACT of 24 (or SAT of 1090*).
Application: No special application required. Eligible students will be identified based on their application credentials. While there is no application deadline, students are encouraged to apply early to be considered for scholarships which do have deadlines.
NOTE: *Score reflects the sum of the Critical Reading and Math portions of the SAT only.

3. Must rank in the top 25% of your high school class or score in the top twenty-five percentile on an ACT or SAT examination, or possess other worthy characteristics that would qualify you for consideration
4. Must be applying to attend an accredited post- secondary vocational or technical school or college or university in the USA as a full-time student.
5. Character and financial need as well as academic skills and aptitude will be considered on each application.
6. Students must provide a complete copy of the general scholarship application, copy of transcript, three letters of recommendation from persons who are not relatives. You must also provide a financial needs report and explain all scholarships, awards or financial aids that you have applied for or have been granted. A brief statement of why

you want to go to college and why you are seeking an education in the particular chosen field of study. This statement should be not more than five hundred words.

Due to the large number of worthy applicants and the limited amount of funds available, the Board of Trustees have restricted those applicants to be considered to persons not receiving A+ program benefits. Although A+ recipients have shown great academic success and achievement, the Trustees are focusing upon applicants without those benefits, as their needs are greater in their first year of post-secondary education. Gen & Kelly Tanabe Scholarship - This scholarship is completely merit-based so financial-need is not something that is considered by the scholarship committee. Additionally, test scores, transcripts, any past academic performance will not be considered. What will be considered is an essay. The goal of this opportunity is to offer a level playing field for students, which is why the essay is the only consideration. The essay should be short (250 words or less) and should answer one of the following questions:

The following scholarships are available through The American Legion. Application deadlines are April 20, 2014.

Basic Criteria for Scholarship Awards – The student must be a resident of Missouri. Applicants must be under the age of 21, unmarried and a descendant* of a veteran with at least ninety days active service in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or Coast Guard, who received an Honorable Discharge for such service. A photocopy of the veteran's DD 214, discharge or separation notice must accompany the scholarship application. Any additional requirements are listed with each scholarship. Applications are available in the counselors' office for the following scholarships.

Lillie Lois Ford Scholarship Fund – Two awards of \$1000 each are given each year. One to a boy who has attended a full session of Missouri Boys State or Missouri Cadet Patrol Academy. The second award is given to a girl who has attended a full session of Missouri Girls State program or Missouri Cadet Patrol Academy.

M.D. "Jack" Murphy Memorial Nurses Training Fund – Currently one \$750 award is given for two successive semesters,

and may, by application, be extended for two additional successive semesters. This award is available to a Missouri boy or girl training to be a Registered Nurse, and may be used in their freshman or subsequent college years. The student must have graduated in the top forty percent of their high school class. Scholarships are awarded for one year, payable \$375 per semester. **Joseph J. Frank Scholarship** – Five awards of \$500 are given annually to individuals who are descendants of a veteran. Applicant must have attended a full session of The American Legion Boys State or The American Legion Auxiliary Girls State program. Applicants must be unmarried, under the age of 21, a current resident of the state of Missouri and must use the scholarship as a full time student in an accredited college or university.

Charles L. Bacon Memorial Scholarship – Two awards of \$500 are given annually in memory of the first Missourian to serve as National Commander of The American Legion. Basic for eligible: Must be a member of The American Legion Family, i.e., Legion Member, Auxiliary Member, S.A.L. Member, or a descendant* of any member thereof. Applicants must be unmarried and under the age of 21, and must use the scholarship as a full-time student in an accredited college or university and a resident of Missouri.

Erman W. Taylor Memorial Scholarship – Two \$500 awards are given annually to a student planning on obtaining a degree in education. To be eligible, individuals must: (1) be a descendant* of a veteran who served 90 or more days of active duty in the armed forces and having an honorable discharge; (2) be a Missouri resident; (3) use the award as a full-time student at an accredited college or university; (4) provide a copy of the discharge certificate for the veteran on whose the application is made; and (5) submit an essay of 500 words or less on the subject **In your opinion, what was the most significant world event of 2013/2014?**

Shane Dean Voyles Memorial Scholarship – One \$500 award will be awarded, annually. (1) Each school in the State of Missouri may nominate **one** student to be considered for the award. (2) The nominee will be selected based on financial need, participation in athletics, school activities and clubs, volunteer work, leadership, high moral standards, and extreme patriotism. (3) Must attend an accredited college/university as a full-time student.

General **First Command Education Foundation: Donaldson D. Frizzell Scholarship** - (6) \$2,500-\$5,000 scholarship; non-renewable will be awarded. Scholarship will be awarded to students seeking associate, undergraduate, or graduate degrees. Also available to those seeking professional certification or attending vocational school. Application requirements: Application form, transcript, essay, references. The online application will be available until *April 7, 2014* or until FCEF receives 500 applications, whichever comes first. Go to <http://www.fcef.com> to apply.

MU-Columbia **MU Alpha Gamma Sigma Scholarship** – This scholarship is meant to reward male high school seniors who are intent upon attending the University of Missouri-Columbia. General **Missouri Education and Training Voucher Program (ETV)** - Open to current, or former foster students who meet one of the following criteria:

1. Currently eligible for Chaffee Services; this includes students that have exited Children’s Division custody at age 17 and one-half, until age 21.
2. Adopted from foster care with the adoption finalized after your 16th birthday.
3. Placed in kinship guardianship from foster care after your 16th birthday.
4. Applicant must be a US citizen, or qualified non-citizen.
5. Your personal assets (bank account, car, home, etc.) must be worth less than \$10,000.
6. Must be at least 18, but younger than 21 (to apply for the first time).
7. Accepted into or currently enrolled in a degree, certification, or other accredited program at a college, university, vocational, or technical school.

Heating, Air-conditioning, & Refrigeration Mechanics, Trade/Technical Specialties **Plumbing-Heating-Cooling Contractors Association: Bradford White Corporation Scholarship** - (2) \$2,500 scholarships; non-renewable. Students enrolling in either an approved 4-year PHCC apprenticeship program or at an accredited 2-year community college, technical college, or trade school. - General **Shell Knob Fraternal Order of Eagles Lodge #4155 Scholarship 2014** - This scholarship has a one-time value of \$1,000. The recipient must have resided in Shell Knob, MO for at least one year and completed his/her senior year at either Cassville H.S. or Blue Eye H.S. The monies will be paid directly to the advanced education facility when enrollment is complete and a class schedule is produced for the coming school year. - General **Cassville High School Alumni Scholarship** – To be eligible for the CHS Alumni Scholarship, an applicant must be a relative of a previous Cassville High School graduate. Applications must be returned to the counselors' office no later than 3:00 p.m. Friday, April 11, 2014. Applications are available in the counselors' office.
- MSU **Missouri State University Leadership Scholarship** –The scholarship is valued at \$1,000 for the academic year and is renewable for three additional years if the recipient completes 30 credit hours each year and maintains a minimum 3.25 (4.0 scale) cumulative grade point average. Only **two** students will be selected to receive the scholarship. Recipients of the MSU Presidential, Board of Governors, or Multicultural Leadership scholarships are not eligible for the Leadership Scholarship. Come to the counselors' office and sign-up if you plan to attend MSU. Deadline to sign-up is *April 4, 2014*.
- General **Central Community United Methodist Church Scholarship** –This scholarship is for any formal education or skill training beyond the high school level. Scholarships are for the freshman year only. Most generally the scholarship amount is \$250.00 per semester, \$500.00 total.
Criteria:
- This education or training will equip a recipient to lead a more productive Christian live.
 - The applicant's high school records, community service participation, and any reference letters will be used to evaluate the likelihood that he/she will complete their training.
 - The applicant must reside in the Shell Knob zip code 65747 area or is the son/daughter of a resident.
