Crowder College Academic Scholarships - Eligibility criteria, deadlines and award amounts should be reviewed when applying for scholarships. The following scholarship information pertains to Crowder College scholarships. Multiple scholarships may be awarded based on student need and eligibility requirements. A+ students are eligible for Academic scholarships. Applications may be found at: Crowder.edu/financial-aid/scholarships

Presidential Honors (Full tuitions, fees and books)

- Must apply and be accepted to Crowder's Honors Program. Applications and eligibility information available at www.Crowder.edu/Academics/Honors
- Renewable for up to three consecutive semesters with a minimum 3.5 cumulative GPA, completion of at least 15 credit hours per semester and a "B" or above in all Honors coursework.
- Fall priority deadline is April 1

The following scholarships require a completed application be submitted online by April 1

Center Scholarship (\$750 per semester, fall & spring, toward tuition, fees and book loan)

- High school graduates who have a minimum 3.5 GPA & will attend the Center from which the scholarship is awarded
- Renewable up to three consecutive semesters with a minimum 3.0 GPA and successful completion of a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester.
- Interested students should apply online and may inquire at a Crowder Center

Trustees (\$650 per semester, fall & spring, applied to tuition and fees and books)

- High school seniors graduating from an accredited high school, ranking in the top 15% of their class OR a student scoring a 25 or higher on the ACT (includes high school and home school graduates.)
- Renewable up to three consecutive semesters with a minimum 3.0 GPA and successful completion of a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester
- Interested students should apply online

DEPARTMENTAL

HONORS

Agriculture, Art & Design, Business & Office Administration, Journalism, Social Sciences, Teacher Education, Spanish. Speech/Debate, and Theatre

- Eligible students must maintain a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA and be enrolled in and successfully complete a minimum of 12 credit hours each semester.
- Scholarships may be renewed for up to three consecutive semesters provided the student maintains the required minimum GPA & Credit hours.
- Scholarship amounts may vary and will be determined by the division chair.
- Interested students should inquire through the appropriate Crowder College Department.

FOUNDATION

May be awarded by major or field of study, general or specific criteria based on donor request

OTHER

Career & Technical Education (\$800 per semester top ranked senior, \$400 per semester - 2nd ranked senior from Technology Centers in Carthage, Crowder-Neosho, Lamar, Franklin-Joplin, Nevada, & Scott Tech- Monett)

- Full-time enrollment within 1 year of high school graduation
- Renewable up to three consecutive semesters with 3.0 cumulative GPA and successful completion of 12 credit hours each semester
- Inquire at Technology Center you attend for application

Student Ambassador (\$800 per semester, fall & spring)

- Students are required to work a minimum of 10 hours per week in Admissions Office
- Renewable up to six consecutive semesters with 2.5 GPA and minimum 12 hours completed per semester
- Scholarship prorated for summer semester and A+ students
- Applications available online at Crowder edu/financial-aid/scholarships/student-ambassadors

Resident Assistantship (Room and board)

- Requires recipient to live in campus housing, work in various campus offices and be on call for emergencies.
- Renewable up to three consecutive semesters with a minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA and minimum of 12 credit hours per semester
- Interested students should inquire at the Campus Life Office

Language Enrichment (Amounts vary)

- Non-native English speakers that desire to attend classes at Crowder.
- Renewable up to three consecutive semesters with a minimum 3.0 GPA and successful completion of a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester.
- Inquire with the English Language Coordinator

PERFORMANCE/ATHLETIC

- Eligible students must maintain a minimum cumulative GPA and meet departmental/athletic requirements.
- Auditions, tryouts, and/or portfolios may also be required.
- Scholarships may be renewed for up to three consecutive semesters as long as student maintains the required GPA and continues to meet department/athletic requirements.

- Scholarship dollar amounts may vary and will be determined by the division chair, coach/Athletic Director.
- Interested students should inquire through the appropriate Crowder College Department/Athletic Program.

PRESIDENTIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$12,500 per year (\$6,250 for tuition and \$6,250 for on-campus housing)

Selection Criteria: Top 10 percent of class (or have a 3.90 GPA on a 4.00 scale) at the end of the sixth semester and minimum ACT of 30 (or SAT of 1400*). (Scores from the October ACT/SAT are the last to be accepted for consideration.)

Application: Apply for admission and complete the Presidential Scholarship Application by December 1.

UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP

Value: Board of Governors Scholarship plus \$2,000 per year for the first and second year to be applied to on-campus housing.

Selection Criteria: Students who are invited to interview for the Presidential Scholarship will be considered.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$5,000 per year.

Selection Criteria: Top 10 percent of class or 3.90 GPA on a 4.00 scale, after the sixth or seventh semester and minimum ACT of 28 (or SAT of 1320*). (Scores from the December ACT/SAT are the last to be accepted for consideration.) Students who receive an International baccalaureate diploma will also be awarded this scholarship. **Application:** Apply for admission by *January 15*.

PROVOST SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$2,500 per year

Selection Criteria: Top 20 percent of class or a 3.70 GPA on a 4.00 scale, after the sixth or seventh semester and minimum ACT of 26 (or SAT of 1260*). Students who rank first or second in their class after the sixth or seventh semester are also eligible. (Scores from the December ACT/SAT are the last to be accepted for consideration.)

Application: Apply for admission by *January 15*.

DEANS' SCHOLARSHIP Value: \$1,500 per year

Selection criteria: Top 20 percent of class (or 3.70 GPA on a 4.00 scale) after the sixth or seventh semester and ACT score of 24 (or SAT of 1180*). (Scores from the December ACT/SAT are the last to be accepted for consideration.)

Application: Apply for admission by January 15.

HUTCHENS/SGA CENTENNIAL LEADERS SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$1,250 or \$2,500 per year (depending on financial need as determined by the results of the FAFSA).

Selection Criteria: Top one-half of class or (3.00 GPA on a 4.00 scale) after the sixth semester and minimum ACT of 20 (or SAT of 1030*) taken during or before October of your senior year. Additionally, a successful applicant will excel in three of four areas of involvement: Leadership, Volunteerism, Performing Arts and Athletics

Application: Apply for admission and *submit a Hutchens/SGA Centennial Leaders Scholarship* application (only available online) by January 30.

INCLUSIVE EXCELLENCE LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$5,000 per year

Selection Criteria: Be admissible to the University by December 1 and have demonstrated academic achievement and a commitment to becoming a leader in an inclusive society.

Application: Complete the Inclusive Excellence Leadership Scholarship Application and apply for admission by *December 1*.

INCLUSIVE EXCELLENCE RECOGNITION AWARD

Value: Up to \$2,000 per year.

Selection Criteria: Students who participate in the Inclusive Excellence Leadership Scholarship interview program but are not selected for that scholarship will be considered for the Inclusive Excellence Recognition Award. **Application:** Complete the Missouri State Inclusive Excellence Leadership Scholarship Application and apply for

admission by December 1.

DIVERSITY IN EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$2,000 per year for first two years and \$3,000 per year for years three and four.

Selection Criteria: Students must meet the criteria for the Inclusive Excellence L eadership Scholarship and must have declared a major that leads to a Bachelor of Science in Education or Bachelor of Music Education degree. **Application:** Complete the Inclusive Excellence Leadership Scholarship Application and apply for admission by *December 1.*

OUT-OF-STATE FEE WAIVER/MIDWEST STUDENT EXCHANGE PROGRAM

Value: A full waiver of non-resident fees for fall and spring semesters (approximate value \$7,050 annually for students taking 30 credit hours per year).

Selection criteria: Non-resident entering freshmen must have either an ACT composite of 24 or higher (or SAT of 1180*) or a 3.50 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale or a class rank in the top 25 percent.

Application: No special application required. Eligible students will be identified based on their application

credentials.

A+ RECOGNITION SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$500 per year

Criteria: Qualify for regular admission to MSU and meet A+ program requirements. Apply for

admission and submit the Missouri State A+ Recognition Scholarship Application by June 1 for full consideration.

MISSOURI STATE ADVANTAGE SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$1,000 per year

Selection Criteria: Awarded to entering freshmen who completed six or more credit hours through the Missouri State University dual credit program with a cumulative Missouri State GPA of 3.00 or higher. This scholarship is renewable for one year only.

Application: Apply for admission *by June 1* for the fall semester. No special application is required. The scholarship will be awarded automatically to qualified students after grades are posted for their final semester of dual credit enrollment.

MISSOURI STATE PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP

Value: \$1,000 for the first year and \$1,500 for the second year.

Selection Criteria: Students are selected for this scholarship based on a combination of financial need and academic potential as demonstrated by a combination of class rank, GPA, and ACT or SAT scores.

Application: Apply for admission and complete the Free Application for Federal Student AID (FAFSA) no later than *Feb. 1.* No special application is required.

MISSOURI STATE BOYS/GIRLS STATE LEADERSHIP AWARD

Value: \$1000

Selection Criteria: Entering freshmen must have both a solid academic record and a strong record of leadership and have participated in Missouri Boys or Girls State.

Application: Complete the General and Departmental Scholarship Application and provide verification of Missouri Boys or Girls State participation to the Office of Student Financial Aid by *March 1*. Student must be admitted to the University in order to access the General and Departmental Scholarship Application.

General

Horatio Alger Association Scholarship Program - The scholarship program provides financial assistance to students throughout the nation who have financial need and have exhibited integrity and perseverance in overcoming personal adversity. Eligibility:

- Be enrolled full time as a high school student in the United States with plans to enter college no later than
 the fall semester following graduation.
- Exhibit a strong commitment to pursue and complete a bachelor's degree at an accredited non-profit public or private institution in the United States (students may start their studies at a two-year institution and then transfer to a four-year institution.
- Demonstrate critical financial need (\$55,000 or less adjusted gross family is required).
- Be involved in co-curricular and community service activities
- Display integrity and perseverance in overcoming adversity
- Hold a minimum GPA of 2.0 (4.0 scale)
- Be a United States Citizen

Missouri Patriot Guard Riders Scholarship - This Scholarship is being offered to Missouri seniors who are sons or daughters of those who fall within the following categories:
