We ask students and staff to adhere to all recommended hand washing and respiratory etiquette while on school premises.

We must stay vigilant as we keep our learning community safe, healthy, and prepared for another successful school year. Our administrative team will be available for questions or concerns that may arise. Thank you for your continued partnership in helping us keep our schools and children safe and healthy.

Cassville R-IV School District Return to Learn Plan

This plan was created in collaboration with other area school districts incorporating input from medical professionals, the CDC, and the Barry County Health Department. This plan may continue to be modified as more data and information is learned.

It is important to note that while the District will make every effort to provide a safe and healthy environment for our students and staff, there are inherent risks with participation in group activities. Therefore, the District is unable to guarantee that students will be free from exposure to various forms of illness. Despite these risks, school safety for staff and students will continue to be a top priority of the District. The Cassville R-IV School District is committed to providing a quality education to all students, while ensuring their safety and well-being. Parents/guardians with questions or concerns are asked to contact their building administrator.

CDC and Barry County Health Department Guidance

• Stay home if you have signs of any infectious illness and see a doctor as soon as possible.

Cassville R-IV Guidelines and Protocols

- The District will remain in <u>Engagement Level 1</u> which includes seated in-person instruction. This plan also includes regularly scheduled extracurricular programs.
- Student masking will be the choice of the parent/student.
- Respond to the "mask" optional choices of others in a professional and respectful manner.
- The district will encourage all other important layers of prevention, such as hand washing and respiratory etiquette, and enhanced cleaning and disinfection procedures

Classrooms

- Appropriate hygiene practices will be reinforced by all staff.
- There will be time during the day for frequent hand washing and sanitizing.
- Students and staff will be observed for illness prior to starting class or the school day. Those experiencing symptoms will be referred to the nurse.

Cleaning/Hygiene Handwashing

- Regular disinfecting will occur with EPA-approved products.
- Portable air purifiers are located in every classroom, breakroom and locker room.
- Hand sanitizer dispensers have been installed throughout the buildings and at exterior doors.
- Hand washing will be frequently promoted as well as hand sanitizing usage.
- Additional equipment and cleaning procedures will be used across the District.



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Health Services (Nurse's Office)

- School nurses will keep students and staff informed of safety best practices.
- If you have medication for your child, please schedule a time with the school nurse to drop it off.
- Parents and students are expected to self-screen at home prior to students entering the building.
- Students or staff demonstrating symptoms will be referred for physician evaluation. Prior to returning to school, consult a school nurse or provide documentation from a physician.

Accommodations & Special Services

- Special education teachers and therapists will continue to provide services for students with IEPs at their building sites. Safety protocols will be followed and put into place for staff and students. If screenings and diagnostic testing cannot be accomplished in-person, virtual options will be reviewed.
- Parents/Guardians are encouraged to communicate with their child's special education case manager before school begins to discuss specific student needs/concerns along with safety protocols put in place for all students.
- Parents/guardians of students in grades 1-12 who indicate via the District registration that they are considering an online option will be contacted by special services personnel to discuss specific programming to address their child's unique needs.
- All services will continue to be provided to students either in-person or virtually when possible as outlined on Form G in the IEP.
- Cassville R-IV School District will provide all necessary accommodations for children with disabilities with respect to the health and safety policies outlined in this plan. Counseling and mental health services are available for students and staff. You may contact your child's building counselor for more information.

Continuity of Services

• If the Cassville R-IV School District is required to move into Engagement Level 3 (Remote Learning), the District will pivot into an online learning environment. Devices will be sent home with students in grades 1-12. All daily learning will be teacher-driven to prevent learning regression. Learning will move forward with normal grading practices in place during this time. The Cassville R-IV School District will provide support for students without internet connectivity.

Virtual Learning

• Both virtual and in-person learning will be available during the 2022-2023 school year. Parents/Guardians are asked to make a decision on what will be best for their families by the 5th academic day of each semester.



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- An application process is required. After the application is submitted, your child's building principal/counselor will make contact with you to discuss your virtual choice.
- If students select full-time virtual learning and would like to participate in MSHSAA Sports and Activities, students must comply with MSHSAA By-Law 2.3.4.b.

Symptomatic Students and Employees

The following information is based on current guidance from national, state, and local health officials.

- Symptomatic students who become ill while at school will be treated in a triage area that is isolated from others. Employees with symptoms from the list below will be sent home. The following symptoms indicate a possible illness that may decrease a person's ability to function productively, but also may put them at risk for spreading illness to others. Please visit the CDC website for a complete-list of expected symptoms.
- Temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher.
- New, uncontrolled cough that causes difficulty breathing or speaking (For those with chronic allergic/asthmatic cough, a change in their normal cough).
- Diarrhea, vomiting, or abdominal pain.
- New onset of severe headaches (especially with fever).
- Loss of taste or smell.

Confirmed COVID Case Action Plan

- Confirmed student/staff positive COVID-19 notifications will result in exclusion from the school setting.
- A positive COVID-19 test will exclude all students/staff until cleared:
 - o 5 days from the onset of symptoms (return on the 6th day) and symptom free
 - Students/Staff with COVID-19 should undergo isolation for at least 5 full days. Day
 0 is the day symptoms began or the day of the positive viral test (for students/staff with no COVID-19 symptoms).
 - Students/Staff who test positive for COVID-19 and never develop symptoms should isolate for at least 5 days. Day 0 is the day of the positive viral test (based on the date of testing) and day 1 is the first full day after the specimen was collected for the positive test.
 - If students/staff continue to have no symptoms, they can end isolation after at least 5 days.
 - Students/Staff should continue to wear a <u>well-fitting mask</u> until day 10 (day 6 through day 10). If they are unable to wear a mask when around others, they should continue to isolate for 10 days.
 - o If students/staff develop <u>symptoms</u> after testing positive, the 5-day isolation period should start over. Day 0 is the first day of symptoms. Follow the recommendations above for <u>ending isolation for people who had COVID-19 and had symptoms</u>.

Direct Exposures

- The District will not order or enforce students/staff to quarantine or isolate from the public.
- The District will partner with parents/guardians to exclude students from the school setting who have or who are liable to transmit any known contagious disease.

School Closures

- The District will consider school closures based upon the **recommendation** of the Barry County Health Department and/or state guidelines.
- It is important to note that should a closure, change of school schedule, and/or exposure to any contagious outbreak take place, the District will use various methods of communication to contact families.

Communication

- Regular updates to the Board of Education, community members, and parents/guardians will be provided as determined by school administration.
- It is imperative that schools have up-to-date contact information. Teachers will share valuable information as well as provide feedback to students when necessary. <u>Please make sure all of your contact information is up-to-date with your child's respective office.</u>

- This plan will be updated as new information is learned.
- This plan is required to be reviewed once every six months by stakeholders.
- The Return to Learn Plan was last updated on August 18, 2022.

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Engagement Level Indicators

Cassville R-IV School District will use Engagement Level Indicators to define health and safety restrictions to provide guidelines for students, staff, parents, and community stakeholders. With guidance from the Barry County Health Department, Cassville School District will adjust Engagement Level restrictions to promote wellness or respond to wide-spread transmission of any contagious disease. Staff, parents, students, and community are asked to assist with wellness efforts.

Normal Operations

TRADITIONAL SCHOOL

All classes will take place in school buildings. Staff and students will maintain normal routines and school safety/security procedures. Parents, visitors, and guests follow all normal school security protocols.

ENGAGEMENT LEVEL 1

No Community Spread--Seated School with Health Precautions

All classes will take place in school buildings. Extra cleaning and safety protocols for staff and students will be followed. Staff and students will be encouraged to follow physical and personal responsibility wellness expectations. Restrictions on parents and visitors in the building.



Minimal to Moderate Community Spread--Seated School Instruction with Technology Support

Staff and students will access buildings and classrooms.

Learning will be provided with a technology integration model. Options for seated and remote learning courses will align and be taught in the building with teachers.

Current wellness protocols for staff and students will be followed. Visitors will be allowed in buildings under special circumstances.



Substantial Community Spread--Remote Learning

Students will receive instruction by teachers using remote learning from home and complete assignments by accessing virtual class platforms.

All buildings will be closed to students and public.



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Social-Emotional & Mental Health

The importance of good mental health cannot be understated at this time.

There are steps school leaders and staff can take to foster health and well-being in themselves and their school communities.

- Awareness, balance, and connection can help:
- Set and celebrate achievable goals;
- Celebrate the resilience of the great people around you who go above and beyond as they support and help others in times of crises.



Questions & Answers

We understand that many of our students are faced with additional stress and/or anxiety. As always, Cassville R-IV wants to partner with families to support students in the best way possible. Counselors are available and can help with local resources.

How will the social/emotional health of my child be addressed when classroom instruction resumes?

- Professional development will be provided for building staff regarding typical childhood reactions to stress and trauma.
- Counselors and social workers will collaborate with teachers on classroom activities to address student mental health upon return to school.
- Cassville R-IV will collaborate with mental health partners on best practices.
- Teachers will provide classroom lessons on school expectations and structure around health, safety and physical distancing practices to help students re-adjust to a full school schedule.

What type of services are available for my students through the school?

- As always, our school counselors are wonderful outlets for kids when they are feeling stressed or overwhelmed with school or life in general.
- Out of district health services provider information is available when students or families are in need of resources which may otherwise be unavailable to them. This includes, but is not limited to school and hygiene supplies, clothes, food, and mental health services.
- Cassville R-IV partners with the Clark Center to promote mental health.



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Instructional and Learning Overview

Protocols for all buildings

• Schools will make reasonable best efforts to minimize risk

Elementary-Primary and Intermediate

Early Childhood & Pre-K

- Students will be selected to attend our half-day program.
 - Class sizes will not exceed 18 students in a classroom.
 - A waiting list will be maintained.
 - Student attendance will be closely monitored. Students failing to maintain consistent attendance will be contacted.

Kindergarten (K) - Fifth (5th) Grade

- In the event of a "Wellness Break" students' education will continue online through the use of Canvas, Google Classroom and/or Seesaw. Students who do not have access to wifi will be eligible to access lessons through the use of an "offline" component.
- It is imperative the school has up-to-date contact information. Teachers will share valuable information as well as provide feedback to students during this virtual learning experience.
- K-5 grading practices will follow the same format as previous years.
- Students will continue having recess.
- K-5 students will have access to PE, Art, Music, Media, Special Education, EL, Title, and intervention

ELL (English Learner) Services

- Elementary ELL students will receive direct support for English language development from their ELL teacher.
- If Cassville R-IV School District closes due to health concerns, students will continue to receive ELL support remote from their ELL teacher.

High School and Middle School

- In-person classes will mirror the teacher's remote platform. In the event of school closure (OR any student/teacher absence), instruction will transition to remote learning immediately.
- In order to maintain adequate transportation records, emergency requests to ride an alternate bus must be submitted to the office no later than 2:00 p.m.
- 6-12 students will retain a "normal" schedule.

VoTech/CTE (Career and Technical Education) Classes will be available for students.

- Some CTE courses require an in-person lab, and those labs will be made available to students.
- o Transportation to Scott Regional Technology Center in Monett will be provided



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Performing Arts (Band, Choir, Speech, Debate, and Drama)

- Students will use their own equipment to avoid sharing. When this is not possible, appropriate cleaning and sanitizing will take place.
- If Cassville R-IV has to close a school or the district closes due to health concerns, students may be allowed limited access to instruments or practice spaces that cannot be achieved at home.

Visual Arts

- Visual art classes within the Fine Arts Department will continue with enrolled students. Appropriate accommodations will be implemented.
- We will utilize all available digital tools and classroom resources to maximize student learning.
- Students will use their own equipment to avoid sharing. When this is not possible appropriate cleaning and sanitizing will take place. Teachers will demonstrate proper hand washing and cleaning of tools, equipment, and media so students can properly clean shared items when appropriate. Students will follow teacher demonstrations and expectations.

Library Media Services

- All students will have access to print and digital materials available through the Cassville R-IV Library Media program.
- All students will be instructionally supported by Middle School/High School media specialist both online and in-person.

Temporary Remote and School to Home Learning Option

In the event one or more students or teachers are unable to attend in person

- Students will be expected to complete coursework through the designated remote learning platform.
- Courses are most-often developed by Cassville R-IV teachers and taught by Cassville R-IV teachers. In some situations, self-paced options might provide alternative curricula.
- 6-12 students will be given feedback through the A-F (traditional) grading system.
- Students accessing remote learning should have adequate internet access. Alternative options for students that do not have adequate internet access will be provided.
- When a student is able or released to return to in-person learning, the student is expected to return to the physical classroom setting



Special Education and Section 504

PK-12th Grade

Level 1: Traditional School/Seated School with Health Precautions: Students identified in need of special education services or accommodations (Section 504) will be provided accommodations and services according to their current plan.

Level 2: In-School Instruction with Technology Support: Students will be provided services and accommodations according to their plan with appropriate safety measures in place. Social distancing will be managed by grade level and area of service.

Level 3: Online with Alternative Methods of Instruction: Learning through remote learning programming or distance services not located on campus. Services and accommodations will be provided in accordance with the students IEP or Section 504. Special Education Teachers and/or Case Managers will be the contact person for provision of services. Related service providers will work in conjunction with teachers and parents to provide appropriate services.



Pandemic Period/Response Activities (School Closed)

The decision to close Cassville R-IV Schools may be made as a means to prevent further spread of an epidemic, or in response to high student and/or staff absenteeism. The Superintendent will make school closure decisions in consultation with the Barry County Health Department and neighboring school district superintendents. Current CDC recommendations will help guide closure decisions.

Possible School Closure Trigger Points:

- Student absenteeism
 - When it is not economically prudent to keep the school open.
- Teacher/Staff absenteeism
 - When the number of staff available to supervise and instruct students drops below what is necessary to maintain a safe learning environment.
- Confirmed case(s) of any contagious disease/illness.
- To protect public health and safety
 - When advised to close by the Governor or state.
- The Superintendent may cancel all activities on district property by outside groups, even if some schools in the district remain open. When a school is closed, activities scheduled at that school, including use by community groups, may be canceled. Activities held at another location that involve students and staff from a closed school may cancel at the discretion of the building principal, in consultation with local health authorities and the school district's director of nursing.
- Schools may be closed to all staff and students, or just students. If schools are closed only to students, staff members are expected to work regular schedules or use appropriate leave (unless otherwise directed by Administration).
