Main Dishes (Pick 2 from each)

 Alphabet race-Lay out letter cards then shout out a letter and have your child run as fast as they can to find it and bring it to you. Story go-round- Make up a cooperative story by letting each person add one sentence. Start with characters and a simple plot."A dog and a cat went to the beach," and let the children take it from there. The sillier the better! Bookmaking- Fold paper in half and staple at the crease to make pages. Have your child tell a story as you write it down. After the story is written, go back and read it to your child so they can illustrate each page. Sticky note letters-Help your child write a few individual letters on sticky notes. Have them take a sticky note letter and go find something that starts with that letter and stick the note on it. To recollect the sticky notes, you can call a letter or make the letter sound and have your child go get that letter. 	 Hidden colors-Choose several different small containers. Have your child help you put a small amount of baking soda in each container, drop in a bit of food coloring, then cover it up with more baking soda so the food coloring can't be seen. Rearrange the cups then give your child a spray bottle or eye dropper filled with vinegar, Have them predict which color they think will be in each cup before squirting it with vinegar and watching the fizzy color come out. Underwater shape finding-draw different shapes on a plain white piece of paper. Set a clear 9 x 12 baking dish on top of the shape paper. Put enough water in to cover the bottom of the baking dish. Set a clear cup upside down in the baking dish. Call out a shape and have your child slide the clear cup through the water to cover the shape. Repeat by calling different shapes. Pipe cleaner shapes-say a shape and have your child build it using pipe cleaners. 	 Math Scavenger Hunt- Have your child follow these directions and write the number each time. Find 2 pencils and 1 blue crayon. How many do you have now? Find 5 blocks and 2 pennies. How many do you have now? Take away 3 blocks, how many items are left? Find 4 socks and 2 stuffed animals. How many items do you have all together? Find 3 spoons, 4 books, and 1 orange crayon. How many items do you have all together? Practice writing numbers.0-10 go even higher! Give your child water and a paintbrush and call out numbers for them to paint on your driveway or sidewalk. Pipe cleaner numbers-say a number and have your child build it using pipe cleaners.
